Prerequisites

(1) For All Merit Badges:

- * Print out the appropriate worksheet from www.meritbadge.org or <http://www.usscouts.org/mb/wkbks/list.html> . Use the worksheet to complete prerequisites and bring it with you to class.
- * Bring a clipboard, pens, pencils, and any other stationery items that you may need.
- * Before the class, read the current Merit Badge Pamphlet and bring it with you.
- * If possible, complete the prerequisites for the Merit Badge BEFORE the class and bring any write-ups, letters, collections, picture, diagrams, etc. with you to share with the counselor.
- * Bring one "Blue Card" signed by your Scoutmaster for EACH Merit Badge subject you will attend. Complete your personal and Troop information on each card PRIOR to class.
- * Bring a water bottle for use during the day. Come prepared for weather.

(2) Specific Prerequisites by Merit Badge. Complete prerequisites PRIOR to class:

- * **Automotive Repair** -None, outside for a portion of the class. Dress appropriately.
- * **Camping** - None.
- * **Citizenship in the Community** - Please review all requirements in advance and be prepared to discuss answers in class. If possible, please bring a laptop, iPad, Chrome Book or other device that you can use to access the internet.
- * **Citizenship in the Nation** - Please review all requirements in advance and be prepared to discuss answers in class. If possible, please bring a laptop, iPad, Chrome Book or other device that you can use to access the internet.
- * **Emergency Preparedness** - Please review all requirements and read the booklet before class and be ready to be part of discussion at midway. Scouts may take this course if they do not have their First Aid merit badge but will NOT have a blue card signed off the day off the midway without proof of completion of the First Aid merit badge (signed blue card for First Aid or sash with merit badge attached are accepted proof). 2c and 8c to be completed at home. Picture (printed or digital) of emergency kits with items laid out on floor and these two items signed off by parents in the merit badge workbook are required. Number 9a also to be completed at home, checklist provided at the end of this packet (see Home and Safety Checklist PDF). Bring completed checklist to midway.
- * **Fingerprinting** - None
- * **Forestry** - 8, this course will include an off-site outing.
- * **Genealogy** - 1, 2, 3, and 6. Please Include 3 generations in #6: Scout, Parents, Grandparents and Great-Grandparents. You will also need access to an email (yours or your parents) to search your ancestry on-line.
- * **Indian Lore** - None
- * **Surveying** - None, this course will be outside most of the day. Dress appropriately.
