

2016 TTFC Adult and Youth Leaders Itinerary

Second weekend: Concentrating on SECOND CLASS

Pre- Requisites: PREARE for camping out.

Meet as a Troop, Older Boys teaching the younger.

Tenderfoot 1a: present yourself to your leader. Show the personal and camping gear you will use. Show the right way to pack and carry it.

Second Class 2e: select foods form current nutritional guidelines. Demonstrate how to transport, store, and prepare the foods you selected.

First Class 2a-d: help plan a menu for breakfast, lunch, & dinner, cooking at least 2 of the meals. Make a budget. List items needed and secure items. (Assign scouts to bring items or take them shopping to secure items.)

TROOP NEEDS TO BRING: WATER, ALL ITEMS TO COOK AND CLEAN FOR DINNER & BREAKFAST, PLUS A COLD LUNCH AND TWO SNACKS

3:00pm **YOUTH LEADERS: STAR & LIFE rank** arrive earlier than their troop to prepare for camp, leadership training & earn service hours.

4:45 **Check-in** {registrars Jacqueline Nash/Misty Brandow }

SCOUTMASTER/ASST. SM/ 11-YRO LEADERS:

Turn in medical binder & get your campsite number.

FYI: using the New Scout book. The old book is different. Where possible I indicated numbers (OB)

5:00 **Set up campsite as a Troop**

ADULT & YOUTH LEADERS supervise & help set up.

Tenderfoot req. 1b: help pitch a tent. pg 276 (OB Tf 2)

Second Class req. 1a: Since joining, participate in 5 separate troop/patrol Activities, 3 of which include overnight camping, on at least 2 of these Campouts spend the night in a tent that you have pitched. (OB 2nd 3a)

First Class req. 1a: Since joining, participate in 10 separate troop/patrol Activities, 6 of which include overnight camping, on at least 5 of these Campouts spend the night in a tent that you have pitched. (OB 1st 3)

Start on dinner when campsite is prepared.

6:00 – 7:00 **Prepare/eat Dinner**

ADULT LEADERS & YOUTH LEADERS help and supervise.

Tenderfoot req. 2a: Assist in preparing pg 304-307 (OB Tf 3)

First Class req. 2e: Serve as a cook. Supervise your assistants. Prepare Breakfast, lunch, DINNER.. Pg 304-306, 310 (OB 4e)

7:00 pm **Clean up**

ADULT LEADERS IF NO YOUTH LEADERS are present, explain and demonstrate. Sign off requirements in each Scouts BSA handbook.

Tenderfoot req. 2b Demonstrate appropriate method of safe cleaning. pg 307-310 (OB Tf 3)

First Class req. 2e: Supervise clean up pg 307-309 (OB 4e)

Prepare for campfire

ADULT LEADERS help supervise and encourage your scouts to create a Patrol yell & skit for campfire while the

YOUTH LEADERS meet with the camp directors.

Prepare for campfire festivities...Choose a leader amongst the leaders, make assignments, fill in the agenda:

Color guard for flag ceremony, pledge, oath, law, motto, slogan, 3 songs, and a prayer. Prepare a skit.

Report to your Scoutmaster or other adult leader in your troop about which parts of the Scout oath and Scout Law relate to what you learned.

Second Class req. 6d: Explain what to do in case of accidents that require emergency response in the home and backcountry. Explain what constitutes an emergency and what information you will need to provide to a responder. Pg 151

Second Class req. 6e: Tell how you should respond if you come upon the scene of a vehicular accident. Pg.152

NEED Troop Leader needs to provide a *lightweight stove or propane stove*.

Camp Director to meet with each Troop's Adult leader before dismissing, Give back Medical forms and receive feedback.

Continue to complete Second Class FOLLOW UPS

Try to accomplish over the next 8 weeks. We would like to work on First Class in September/October.

1a. Participate in 5 separate troop activities, 3 of which are campouts. Not including troop or patrol meetings.

1c. Select a location for your Troop/Patrol to camp out.

2b. Using Tenderfoot requirements 3d prepare tinder, kindling and wood fire. Take it on your next campout.

2c. Use the Tinder, kindling and wood.

3b. Take a 5 mile hike on your next camp out.

5a-5d. Aquatics

7a. & 7b. Fitness; follow up 4 weeks after completing Tenderfoot requirement.

8a. Participate in a Flag Ceremony.

8c & 8d. Personal finance requirements listed under Citizenship, Scouts to do with their parents.

8e. Two hour service project.

10. Scout Spirit; Demonstrate Scout spirit

Combine these requirements:

11. Scoutmaster Conference/11 yro Leader Conference

Scouts should be in full uniform for this and have their BSA handbook.

One at a time, the Scouts meet with their Scoutmaster or assigned leader, 2-deep leadership is always required. ...

Reminder... Scoutmaster Conferences are not behind closed doors...just a separate area of the general meeting room.

12. Board of Review Three Troop Committee members are present. They do not re-ask "how to", instead they ask "how are"... They look for ways to support the boys and pass on information to the Scoutmaster.
