

TTFC Itinerary 2016
BE PREPARED!!!

Scoutmasters, Asst. Scoutmasters, 11 year old leader or those assigned:

(5/13/16) Weeks prior, make sure to register all boys attending. Make sure they have completed requirements for the Scout rank. All Scouts in your troop rank Star and above should be registered as Youth Leaders to serve as the Troop Guide(s). Collect all medical paperwork and put in a binder along with a list of your Troops responsibilities.

(Senior Patrol Leader, Assistant SPL, Patrol leader(s), Quartermaster, Scribe, Historian, Leave No Trace Trainer, etc.)

(6/03/16) A week prior to TTFC be prepared: (sign off as completed in BSA handbook.)

Senior Patrol Leader with the guidance of Adult leader to complete the following:

(Scribe should take notes and put in binder to bring to TTFC.)

*Fill out Duty Roster: Head Cook, Asst. Cook, Fire builder or the person preparing cook stove, Water man, Kitchen Clean up, Asst. KCU, Patrol site clean up, etc.

*Fill out Menu Planner: (1st Class req. 2a, 2b, 2c, 2d, 2e)

*Plan for Dinner, Breakfast, Lunch (non-cooking items for lunch) (1st Class Req. 2a)

*Prepare for two snack breaks.

*Use the MyPlate nutritional model when planning. (2nd class req. 2e)

*List your budget. (1st class req. 2b)

*Secure the ingredients needed (1st class req. 2b)

*Show items needed to prepare the meals and bring the items. (1st class req. 2c)

*Demonstrate/teach safe handling (1st class 2d, TF req. 2b,)

*Cooks to be prepared. (1st class 2e, 2nd Class req. 2e, TF req. 2a)

*Explain when it is appropriate to use a fire for cooking or other purposes. *You will need a cook stove; there will not be a fire pit to use for cooking.* (2nd class req. 2a, d)

(06/08/16) A few days before: (sign off as completed in BSA handbook.)

* Backpack check and make sure everyone has a small personal first aid kit. (TF 1a & 4d.)

* Explain the Outdoor code. (TF req. 1c.)

* Explain the Buddy System (TF req. 5a.)

* Explain the Edge Method (TF req. 8.)

(06/10/16) FRIDAY NIGHT TTFC Camp

3:00 **Youth Leaders** arrive for instruction and prepare for campfire.

5:00 Set Up Camp (TF req. 1b.) Start on dinner when completed.

6:00 – 7:00 Prepare Dinner (TF req. 2a, 2b, 2c, 2nd Class req. 2e, 1st class 2e,)

During Dinner **YOUTH LEADER** teach how to safely clean dishes and procedures for safe handling food, good nutrition, transporting storing and preparing food and disposing. (TF 2b, 2c, 2nd Class 2e, 1st Class 2d)

7:30 Clean up Scouts demonstrate safe cleaning.

8:00 – 8:30 Scouts explain the other procedures that were taught to the Adult Leaders before signing off as completed in BSA handbook.

8:00 – 8:30 **Youth Leaders** prepare for campfire.

8:30 - 9:30 Campfire (Constitutional Rights 1st Class 9a OR the 3R's 2nd class 9a & 9b)

10:00 Lights out (By this point 13 First Class items, 5 Second Class and 12 Tenderfoot)

There are a total of 101 requirements in all.

(06/11/16) Saturday

7:00 am make breakfast, eat clean up

8:00 – 9:00 Pack up all gear, remove from campground and move to the Willow Shelter.

9:00 Willow Shelter Hiking (TF 5a, 5b, 5c) 1 mile walk (part of TF 6a)

10:00 Push ups, sit-ups, sit and reach (TF6a 3 items)

10:30 Snack/free time at the playground adjacent to the Willow Shelter

11:00 Willow Shelter Poisonous and hazardous Plants (4b, 4c)

12:00 Lunch (reminder; non-cooking items, such as sandwiches)

12:30 Willow Shelter First Aid (TF 4a 1-8 items)

2:00 Service Project (TF 7b)

3:00 Knots & Hitches

4:00 Camp dismissed
