WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

Wood Badge is designed to meet the advanced leadership needs of all Scouters, particularly unit level Scouters, such as Cub leaders, Scoutmasters and assistants, Venturing Crew Advisors, Committee Chairs and additional members serving Scouters at the district and council levels.

To attend a Wood Badge course, individuals must:

- 1.Be registered members of Scouting America.
 (Young adults must be 18 and older to attend as long as the appropriate Youth Protection guidelines are followed. They do not need to be registered in an adult leadership role).
- 2. Have completed the basic training courses for their scouting position.
- 3.Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment. All participants are required to complete the annual Health and Medical record form.
